



ARTICLE XV LIONS OF MICHIGAN FOUNDATION BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Section 1. The district is a participating member of the Lions of Michigan Foundation with full voting rights and privileges.

Section 2. Election/Appointment/Terms of Office of Trustees

- a. The Board of Trustees shall consist of two (2) elected Trustees from District 11 D-1.
- b. The Trustees will be elected in alternate years.
- c. Under special circumstances, the Board of Trustees may authorize the District Cabinet of a participating district to appoint additional Trustees to the board that will serve in an ex-officio capacity without voting power.
- d. The Trustees may serve no more than three (3) consecutive two-year terms followed by a one-year break before becoming eligible for reelection.
- e. Trustees shall be elected according to the procedures for the election of district officers as provided for by the bylaws of the participating districts.
- f. Trustees shall take office immediately upon the adjournment of the later of either the Annual Meeting of Lions Clubs International or the Lions of Michigan Service Foundation annual meeting following their election.

Section 3. Candidate requirements

- a. A candidate for the office of Trustee shall be an active member of a Lions Club in good standing in his or her district.
- b. Shall have served as President of Secretary of Lions Club for a full term or major portion thereof or as a member of the board of directors of a Lions Club for no less than three (3) years.

Section 4. Meeting Attendance

a. Trustees, who for any reason cannot attend a Board of Trustees meeting, may designate the District Governor, a Vice District Governor, or an appointed Trustee (described in Section 2c of this article) from their District as their representative and shall have the same voting power as the elected Trustee.

Section 5. Compensation/Reimbursement

- a. All Trustees shall serve without compensation.
- b. Reimbursement for Foundation related travel, lodging, or other out-of-pocket expenses incurred by Trustees (including ex-officio Trustees) shall be made in accordance with the Foundations Policy Manual.

Section 6. Vacancy

a. Any vacancy occurring in the office of Trustee shall be temporarily by a person appointed by the District Cabinet. A Trustee filling a vacancy shall hold office until next annual convention of the district and until his/her successor has been duly qualified and elected

Our district can submit two nominees one for a living Lion and one for a deceased Lion who had a significant impact on Lionism in Michigan.



[Soon] I was on a plane to Michigan for the best and busiest week of my life. As soon as I got there, I knew I was going to have an amazing time. I had the opportunity to experience so many things I never would have had the opportunity to had it not been for Leader Dog. They had tandem biking, ziplining, rockwall climbing, beep kickball, scavenger hunts, game nights, driving simulators, and so much more. The best part, though, was that I got to experience all these activities with other blind and visually impaired teens. I made so many friends that week, and to this day, three years later, I consider some of those people some of my best friends.

If you ask any alumni from camp what their favorite part of the week was, there's a 9 out of 10 chance that they're going to say, "Dog Day." This is the day when we got to work with a guide dog and a guide dog mobility instructor (GDMI) to learn about what working with a guide dog is like.

George Daly Award

The explanation of how a Lion is chosen to receive the George E. Daly Award

A George E. Daly Award has been established which is administered by a committee consisting of two (2) Past District Governors who are in their second and third years out of office District Governor and three (3) non-Lion members of the community selected by the two Lion members and approved by the District Cabinet each year on or before the midwinter cabinet meeting. The Past District Governors on this committee will act in an advisory capacity only and will have no vote in the selection of the candidate to receive the award. The non-Lion members shall have one vote each for the selection of the candidate. The Past District Governor serving the one-year term shall act as Chairman of tis committee. In the event a Past District Governor of the second or third year out of office cannot serve they shall be replaced by a Past District Governor the next higher year out of office.

The committee will select a candidate for this award who must have:

- a. Been a Lion at least three years
- b. Had perfect attendance for the past three years
- c. Been a member in good standing of a Club in good standing in this District
- d. A Lion of high moral character.

Judging will be based on the following criteria:

- a. Offices and / or chairmanships in the Club
- b. Lions' projects participated in
- c. Accomplishments of this Lion in service to the community
- d. Accomplishments of this Lion in service to Lionism

Any Club that wishes to nominate a candidate for this award shall do so by submitting a form signed by the Club Secretary or President to the chairman of this committee listing the candidates' qualifications by deed and year occurred. The form for this award will be provided by the District.

The Chairman of this committee will receive the nomination forms and remove the nominee's name, town and Club. He will then assign a number to the form. The voting members of this committee will vote on their choices. First, second and third choice with three (3) points for first choice, two (2) points for second choice and one (1) point for third choice. Nominees receiving zero points along with the nominee receiving the least number of points in each round dropped from consideration until only one nominee remains.

The District Governor and the voting members of his cabinet shall not be eligible for this award during their terms of office. No Past District Governor shall be eligible for this Award.

This Award will not be given if, in the estimation of the Committee, no one is worthy of the award that year.

No other award will be established in the District with any direct or indirect link to this award. The prestige of this award will be continually protected.
