



## We provide comfort bags to kids in need

Dr. Mary Welsh and Joe Welsh are co-founders of Susie Q's Kids, a 501c3 non-profit, created in honor of their late daughter Susie McBride-Welsh (Susie-Q) which creates comfort, sensory and grief bags to brighten and inspire the lives of children and young adults in hospitals (health issues), foster care, shelters, and those grieving the loss of loved ones.

Imagine the smile on the face of a child receiving our bear, blanket, and comfort bag:

- Kids in hospitals physical, emotional, and mental health issues,
- Kids in shelters homelessness issues,
- Kids in foster care permanent or short-term, and
- Kids grieving the loss of loved ones

Susie Q's Kids was awarded "Community Partner of the Year" by the American Foundation of Suicide Prevention (AFSP) for their work in the community addressing mental health and suicide prevention awareness. They have also participated In the Barb Smith Suicide Resource and Response Network and Kevin's Song Conferences.

Dr. Mary is on the Board of Bereaved Parents of USA (BPUSA) Macomb Chapter, conducted workshops locally and nationally, and facilitates for BPUSA, Compassionate Friends, and New Hope Center for Grief Support.

Through her speaking, Dr. Mary focuses on the message of spreading mental health and suicide prevention awareness as well as focusing on the Four Aspects of Positive Reflection. By addressing high school students and youth groups, the kids receive the message and help other kids by assembling hygiene bags. Kids helping kids!

The comfort bags are provided to other nonprofits for distribution to kids in their programs such as hospitals, shelters, foster care agencies, and those supporting children grieving the loss of a loved one.
