On May 19, Saginaw, Tittabawassee and Spaulding Townships were affected by the flood from the failure of the Edenville Dam. District 11-D1 boundary, Saginaw County, is downstream from Midland. A \$10,000.00 LCIF Disaster Relief Grant was requested and received for District 11-D1 to assist those affected by the flood in the district. Lion Steve Goss started the ball rolling and Lion Matt Tetlloff and First Lady Lion Deb VanTol put Lions boot-on-the-ground in the townships. Lions continue to serve. Thank you to all who volunteered.

Disaster Relief Fund

A district disaster relief fund is being setup. The \$10,000 LCIF Disaster Relief Grant serviced Saginaw and Tittabawassee, \$7300. More was needed to do similar relief to Spaulding Township. A request was sent to the club secretaries and presidents requesting additional funding from the clubs and/or individual Lions to aid in this 2nd underserviced area. If the funds collected exceeds the need, the balance will be the seed money for the new District will need to setup guidelines for its use.

The District Disaster Funding Request was emailed to the district mailing list on Friday, May 29 and requested the commitment of funds by May 31st. As of this writing, pledges/donations have been received from these clubs: Auburn-Williams, Great Lakes Bay Area Sports, Bridgeport, Carrolton, Davison, Saginaw West, Chesaning, Linden, Merrill, Fenton, Montrose. Individual Lions have also pledged to help: John and Rosalie Schmidt, Diana Fairgrieve, Mike Phelps, Jeff Hunt and some anonymous Bay City Lions members. It is known that many clubs need a vote to spend money. So I know this list


